

What Are Those Tall Columns in the Median?

Have you been wondering about those towering structures sprouting up along the center median on U.S. 183 North? You're not alone! Their primary function is to support substantial overhead signs and toll gantries. Don't mistake them for bridges and overpasses; they serve a different role altogether.

Once construction is complete, these columns will play a vital role in enhancing the driving experience for commuters. The overhead signs they support will provide essential information such as express lane pricing, entrance, and exit details. This means smoother navigation and better-informed decision making for drivers navigating the U.S. 183 route. Stay tuned for more updates.


Construction Photo Gallery
