



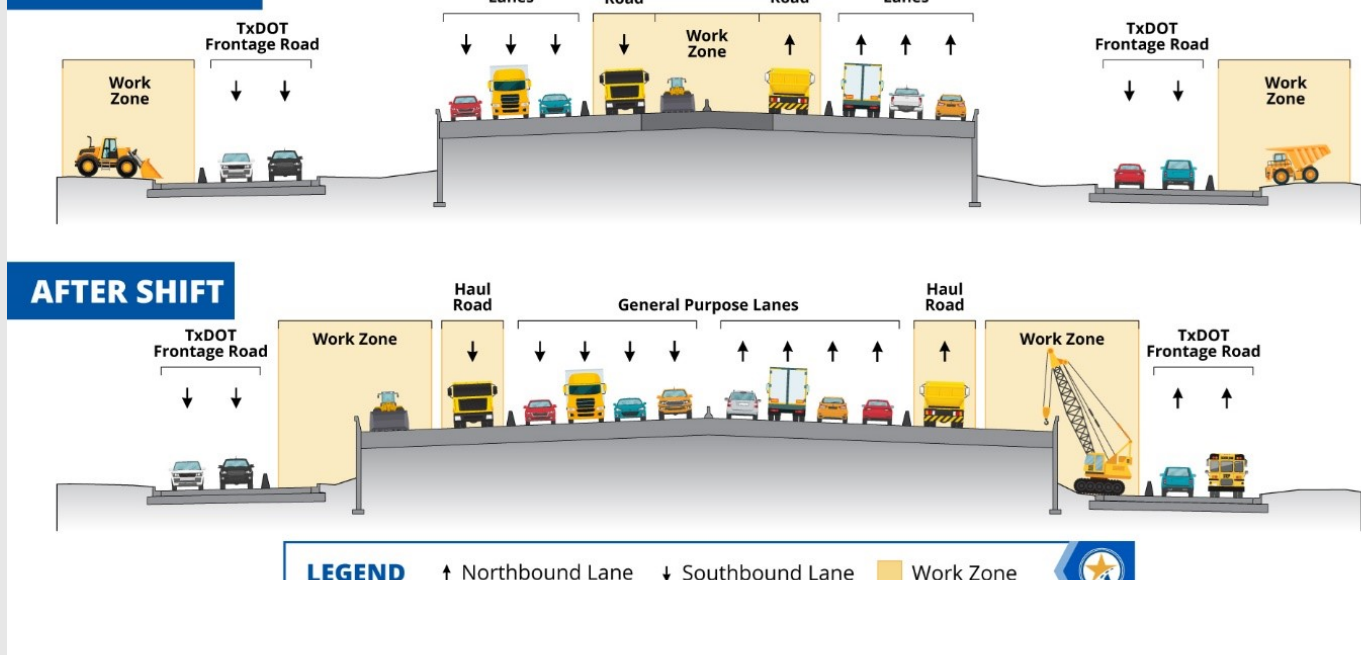
183 North Mobility Project



Ongoing Traffic Shift

There is a big change coming to the 183 North Mobility Project, and it's one we hope you'll be excited about.

In mid-June, crews began work to facilitate a gradual traffic shift along both the southbound and northbound US 183 mainlanes to allow crews to focus on work on the outside lanes of the project AND open four continuous lanes to traffic in each direction. This traffic shift work will continue throughout the summer.



Due to the corridor's length, the project team will be opening sections of the fourth lane gradually over time. Each night they will open an additional 3,000-4,000 feet of roadway allowing access to the fourth lane. The project team is finishing up Segment 1 on the southbound mainlanes at Loop 360 and then will switch to Segment 2 on the northbound mainlanes. After the northbound mainlanes are complete, the project team will move to Segment 3, the final section from MoPac to Loop 360, towards the end of summer. Please keep in mind that all construction is dependent on weather and other factors and is subject to change.

Frontage Road Closures

Frontage road closures will occur over the summer to facilitate improvements coming to US 183 as a part of the project.

Starting from south to north, our teams will progressively work on constructing drainage and retaining walls along US 183 from SH 45 to MoPac. This will require periodic frontage road closures. Crews will be prioritizing southbound lanes initially and managing closures on a wall-by-wall basis. Remember to plan extra travel time during your commute and stay informed by signing up for our weekly Travel Alerts.

National Safety Month

Emergency Preparedness:

Create an emergency plan with your family and build an emergency kit with essentials like water, non-perishable food and flashlights. Don't forget to stay informed by signing up for local alerts such as the 183 North Travel Alerts, as well as identifying emergency/evacuation routes and the locations of hospitals in advance.



Driving Safety:

Avoid distractions while driving, follow speed limits, especially in construction zones, and ensure your vehicle is well maintained by regularly checking brakes, tires, and lights.
