Extended Ramp Closures



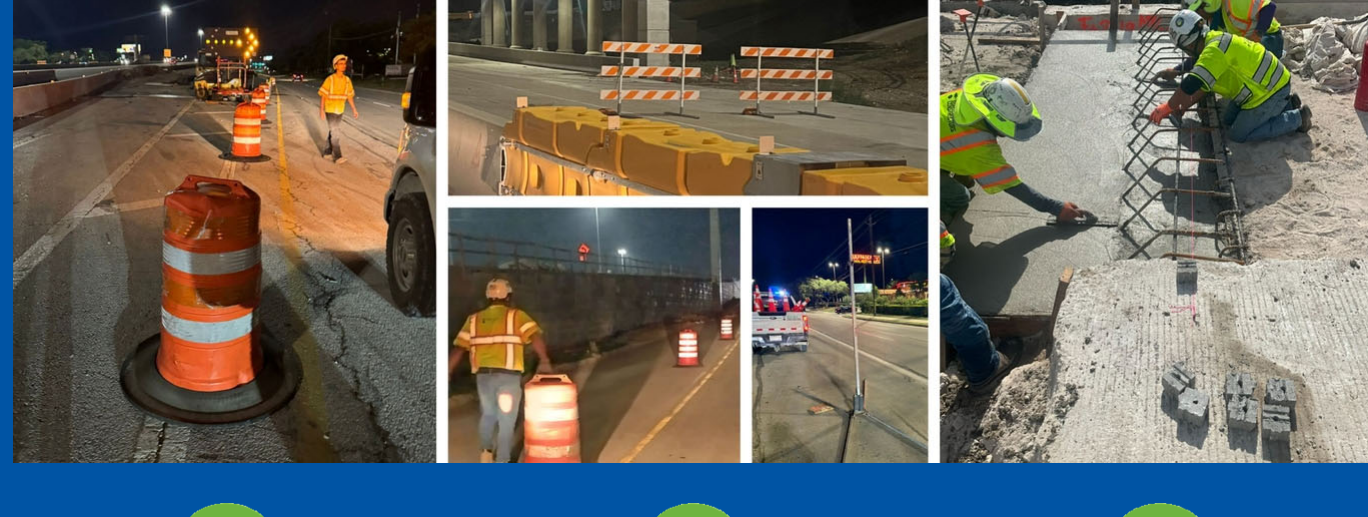
As part of ongoing efforts to accelerate the project's timeline, crews may be implementing a series of extended closures on various on-and off-ramps along the corridor this summer. These closures are necessary to facilitate key construction activities and ensure work continues efficiently and safely on the 183 North corridor.

Get a Behind-the-Scenes Look: Why Full Closures Matter

Ever wonder what's really happening during those full closures of the roadway? We make it a point to limit impacts to the traveling public as much as possible as a part of our project ethos, but sometimes lane closures, even full closures of the highway, are unavoidable in order to accomplish needed tasks. Rest assured, we don't take these closures lightly, and when they happen, we make the most of them.

Close in Small Sections

By closing small sections of an entire roadway for overnight stretches, our crews can maximize every hour. Ideally, completing more work in less time without the constant stop-and-start that comes with closing one lane at a time. This not only helps expedite the project schedule but also creates a safer environment for workers and drivers alike.

Lane Closures Start Early

Keep in mind that crews will enact various lane closures in the few hours prior to a full closure in order to safely facilitate closing the entire roadway. Drivers are encouraged to **check out our Travel Alerts page** or our X (formerly Twitter) account before they embark on their journey, because we aim to post all full closures in advance of the activity each day.

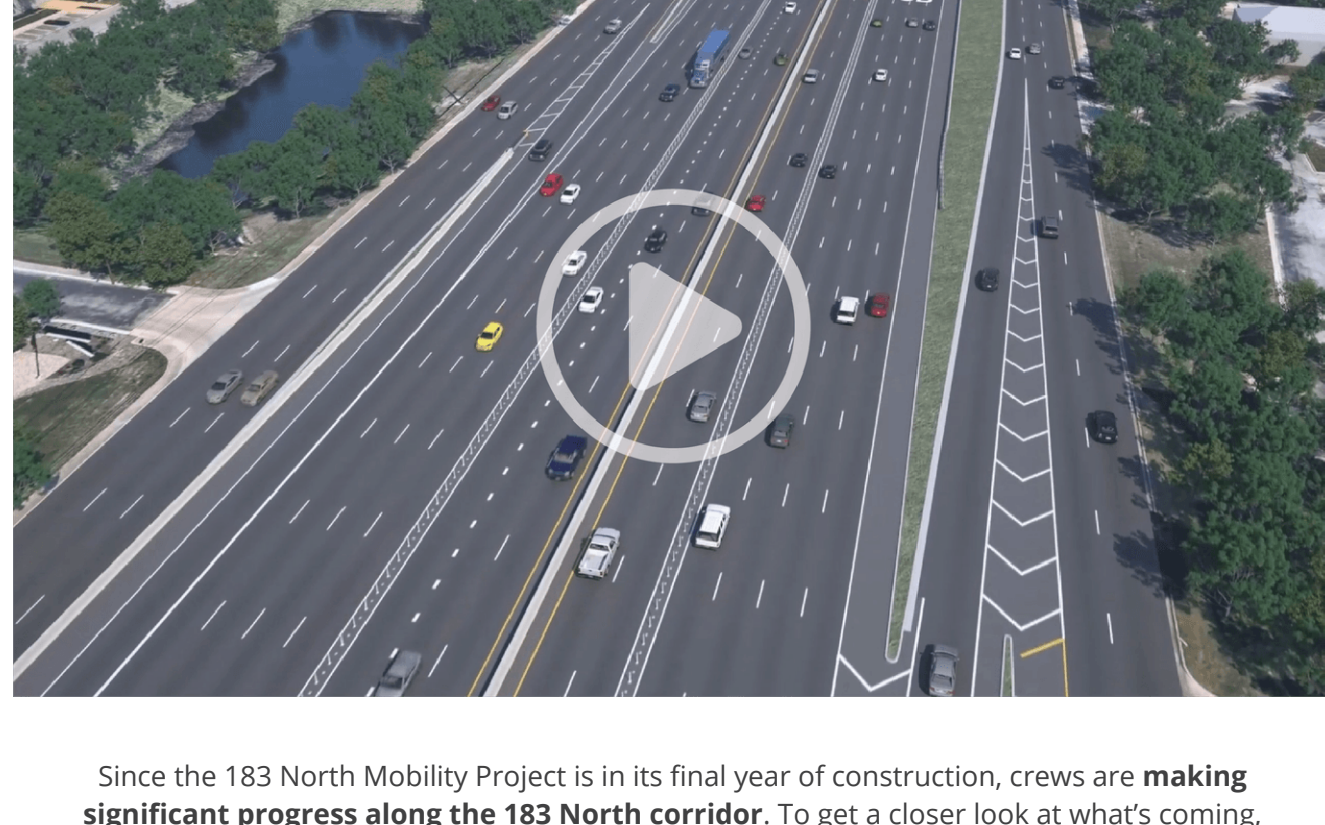

There's Always a Detour

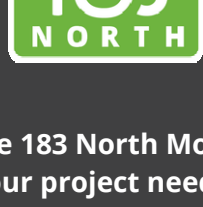
Detours will always be available, follow information provided on the on-road signage. It's important that drivers slow down and watch for signage to keep everyone safe in the work zone.
